December is a good month to review home fire safety before the holidays.

If November passed without changing batteries on smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, now is the time to do it.

New Year Eve is often accompanied by fireworks in wetter climates. Consult the GRRHOA Fireworks Policy if you contemplate displaying fireworks. Montana Code Annotated (MCA 50-63-103) states that a person who sets a fire is liable for any damages it creates. The GRR Fire Department recommends against fireworks on GRR at any time.
